

Grateful thanks from Knysna

We reside in Knysna and as with large parts of the country, we are suffering from a drought. We eagerly looked forward to the promised deluge of rain from the monster cold front approaching the Cape on 7th June 2017. Little did we know that we should have braced for an inferno. We saw the smoke from the fires approaching during the entire day.

Later in the afternoon, a friend from a neighboring estate phoned and said that we should rather evacuate since her husband had taken a vantage point and saw the ominous fire approaching our area – Welbedacht.

With this advice, we quickly packed some items of clothing as well as our more important documents and left our house. At this point I phoned the School of Truth asking for prayers for our safety and wellbeing. Of course we did not want our house to burn down. We did not have a fixed idea of where to go but headed for the waterfront where we assumed we would be safe, to take stock of our situation and discuss our options. Having been assured by Jackie at the School that all things are certain with God, we were strangely at ease and calm since we were possibly facing the most devastating of outcomes.

Unexpectedly my wife's phone rang and another friend of ours enquired after our wellbeing since they knew we stayed in the Welbedacht area and had heard that it had been evacuated. She insisted that we came to them for the night. We were thankful to her for this invitation and spent a very calm evening with them, where we felt very safe. As the evening progressed we saw the fire encroaching on the Knysna Heights suburb and saw the fire jumping hundreds of metres at a time and heard the sound of gas cylinders exploding. Yet all the time we had calmness and sense that all would be well regardless of whether our house burnt down or not. Not fatalistic, but a truly serene feeling.

We returned to our house the following morning and saw that apart from the house being saved, not a petal or a leaf in the garden was lost. Some plastic covers over chairs stacked outside had small holes burnt in them. The fire had burned around our little estate in an odd horseshoe shape. A house, some 30 metres behind ours, suffered major fire damage while another, 50 metres in front of ours burned down in totality. Behind us another lodge burnt down totally while the Knysna Hollow resort over the road burned to the ground. In truth a ring of fire burned all around our estate leaving three of the five houses unscathed.

I am so thankful to the School for their prayers for us. In the face of total calamity, we were given a deep sense of peace and wellbeing. A friend gave us a safe place to stay away from the devastating blaze and our house was spared from the conflagration. There can be no doubt that our Heavenly Father placed His hands about us that night and cared for us according to His promise that He would never leave us nor forsake us. We thank God for His magnificent blessing to us and also the School for their prayers for us, bolstering our limited faith

Faith with Works



At times, when we are confronted with problems that our lying intellect tells us we are incapable of solving, the realisation of our at-one-ment with God becomes a little difficult. Doubts and fears arise which prevent our finding the

consciousness of the indwelling Presence. We have been taught that according to our faith it is done unto us, and as we look around we find people falling by the wayside, emotionally frustrated, mentally confused, physically out of tune with health, separated in awareness from God's abundance, and all of them expressing very little faith indeed.

Because we think we are intelligent, we quite rightly assess things in accordance with the reports we receive from our senses. We cannot behave like sheep or children led by teachers, ministers or mystics, we must understand what we are doing, and to that end we reason with God.

We at the School of Truth teach one fundamental thing. It is for you to listen to what we say, to use your mind, to analyse it, and then admitting that you cannot help yourself, to take the only way open to you which is that of *trying* the course we prescribe. Realising that you have everything to gain and nothing to lose, you should practice it spiritually, mentally, emotionally, physically and materially; and if you have tested it to the utmost and found that it does not work, you should discard it. There are tens of thousands who as a last resort have come to God through the School of Truth and these are the people who have spread the teaching throughout the world, not by talking, but by their example.

What you need in this study is, first, a willingness to accept the principle, and then the courage steadfastly to work with it.

In my life I have discovered three things: (a) that if I am early, God is early also, (b) if I am always on time, so is He, and (c) if I am late, He is late as well. When I tell people this they raise their eyebrows asking me what God can possibly have to do with my timing, to which I reply, "Everything! What you see before you, and I see before me, are the living temples of God who is aware of all our needs, conscious of our difficulties and struggles, and desires with an infinite love to release Himself through us because we are His creations in which He wishes to see SELF-SUFFICIENCY. He does not want us to be parasites, but *individuals*."

Let me illustrate. You and I expect God to do things for us. I know that He can work for me only through me so I sit down waiting for Him to act. I, mark you, am contributing nothing, so how do you think He will react? He sits down with me and nothing happens. Then it strikes me that I am not a passenger, but the director of the Spiritual Presence within me; so even though I feel a trifle bewildered, I take a faltering step forward, proceeding a little anxiously in the direction of my desired good, after which I discover that *God has started to walk with me*. My mind begins to clear, all the problems that seemed so insurmountable fall into the right perspective, my anxiety dies down, I see that there can be no hindrances when God, as an individuality, is looking through my eyes, giving with my hands, walking on my feet.

You and I have both built up an image of weakness and failure in our awareness; we are trying in vain to do things on our own, instead of with God who works through us. You may tell me that you cannot feel Him, but you can. All day long you behold His hand functioning in terms of beauty, health, happiness, prosperity and abundance, and if you do not envy those who have these things, at least you murmur, "If only I could have that and that, but it is not for me." As you thus admit that you have not the understanding or ability to produce these amenities, they do not enter your experience. I, in contrast, say to my Creator, "If I am Your image and likeness, irrespective of how I *feel*, as long as I take the practical steps, that will be all You require of me. If I put my trust in You, you will, despite my omissions and commissions, bring to pass for me. You do not say that you will 'think matters over', You say, 'God forward' and in my ignorance, relying entirely upon Your Understanding – with which I identify myself – I do precisely that." I do not ask, Why does my good not come to me? Why is it being withheld? Why do people interpose between me and my success or prosperity?" I look inside, into my own mind and heart because experience has taught me that my vision is there, not elsewhere. If the notion arises that someone or other is obstructing my good I ask myself whether I am trusting in God or humanity, and since I know how I should think and feel, the answer is not difficult to come by.

At one time I used to blame others for my troubles, not realising that these were experiences (not personalities) that were being presented to me to expand my consciousness and develop my understanding. Now I ask, "How much are you giving to yourself? How much is this or that one withholding from you?" It is, of course, a matter of my own giving. If my hands are only slightly open, that will be the measure of my bestowing and releasing; if they are wide open that will prove my complete confidence in my Divine Supply which I shall never need to check, and must never doubt. I must, and do, put God first in my life, then my fellows, and lastly myself, and according to the teachings of Truth (which I have proven) "the last shall be first." As long as I followed this rule I found that I was establishing the consciousness of God's Kingdom within me, and becoming a steward of His unlimited Bounty of joy, happiness, prosperity and success, which when I released It, with no tags attached, came back to me multiplied a thousand fold.

I am dealing with my Creator who gives me my life, my love, my health, my body, the ability to think, feel, speak and act, for all of which I am truly grateful. Since He has invested me with these qualities, if I am His temple, I must dispense them, for you and I are the only channels He has through which to release His good that indwells us. The average person looks at himself and thinks, "How can I, this miserable individual, be health, love, success, prosperity and happiness?" But what he is seeing is only the personality. If he would turn his gaze inward and perceive there the image and likeness of God he would discover that he was inseparable from the Universal Presence and that once he really knew this, the Divine Substance would flow into him and fill him full with the good that is God. In all sincerity I can tell you that when you cease to look outside yourself, every day will be for you one of happy surprises.

For many years I have been working along these lines and every single day I still wonder at the unseen Presence, at the way in which It anticipates our needs and provides for them. You never get used to the feeling that Something, somewhere, knows of your needs and will not supply them in any limited way but with abundance to share and to spare. This you will experience only if you put God first, then humanity and lastly yourself. Over the years I have learned to build my security on insecurity, upon the UNSEEN. Everyone's daily prayer should be, "To me this day my daily bread" – that is, "You be today the supply of my every need."

As a result of trusting to His Providing all these years, never wondering if or how He will work, I have developed a sense which glorifies and completely relies on His Omnipotence. If I did not know the Law which rules that none can receive what he has not earned, I should say that I did not deserve what I have received, but to me God IS, therefore I am - His Being fulfilled – and if I am *that* then the Presence which constitutes me can never diminish but only increase. I marvel that some of those whom I have been teaching for over 30 years still cannot see that. They continue to run from person to person, place to place, always hoping to find an easy way out

of their troubles, but there is no such; we all have to deserve our good by *earning it*, and to this end we distribute it fearlessly, without questioning or any idea of withholding.

Does this seem difficult to you? I told you the story of the 65-year-old taxi driver who used to pick me up at 7 a.m. on my return from Bloemfontein and Kimberley and drive me to the garage in which my car was awaiting me. One morning he asked me what I did and I said that I tried to teach people how to have faith, to which he replied, "You know, mister, the open hand can never be empty." I had been practicing that for nearly forty years but it had never struck me just like that. I had thought that my hand was the Hand of God and that it was for me, fearlessly, to release His love, faith, substance (my heart and hands) to others, and to keep on praying for them, not for myself. But suddenly it came to me that *if I closed my hand it could not be filled*. After years of following this course it was a taxi-man who gave me the answer to what all that time I had been practicing.

When, consciously or subconsciously, you discover the Nature of God, fearfulness is replaced by fearlessness, and your hands are always open since it is only fear that closes them. When you are joyous and happy, free from tension, nothing can destroy you.

How much courage do you possess? You may think that what you want is health, happiness, a house, car, clothes, money, a trip, but what you really crave is the knowledge that GOD IS WITHIN YOU or is the Presence working through you in whatever form you may be in need of. I was fortunately

in discovering this nearly thirty years ago, when Substance started pouring into my life in a heaped-up, running-over measure to share and to spare. But it was hard work. It meant my thinking all day long in terms of health, happiness and prosperity, with no let up at all so that I had no leisure for inner peace or contentment until I discovered that it was GOD, not things, that I had to seek. I used to pray, "Please, God, give me mental security, emotional balance, let me feel Your Presence, let me know that it is only You I need, that all the other things will come when I am certain of Your Indwelling."

Finally I stopped my daily working for manifestations, *I let go*, and lovingly, happily, put the whole responsibility upon Him. Only then did I begin to live and to have everything. I no longer concerned myself with the future or with any of my affairs; *they* were God's business which is what the Christ had in mind when He said, "seek ye first the Kingdom of God and all these this shall be added unto you."

This realisation (which none can purchase) is worth more than any man can pay: it is INNER SECURITY. Once he has it he can say, "The Lord is my Shepherd, I cannot – not I shall not – want. He is my emotional peace, my mental stability, my bodily health, the prosperity in my affairs." All this is today Reality for me and I would pass it on to all who need it. One does not force it upon those who are not ready for it. It is the Pearl of Great Price, the peace that passeth understanding which comes after much struggling and must be fervently sought before it is achieved. The problems that present themselves to us are not sent by God; *we* attract them so that by the exercise of our spiritual faculties we may overcome them. It is a confusing, frightening pursuance in the beginning, but once we have gained the mastery over it, what dividends it pays! Then we can ask anything "in My Name," in the awareness of the UNITY of all being with God, and it shall be given unto us. Is not this what you need?

Look at humanity, battling and fighting to make a living, depending upon employers, when God, their creator, is the only one they have to serve. He is my employer and will pay me what I am worth, not in terms of hard work, but of love. He does not say, "According to your labour" but according to your faith it shall be done unto you. Love is the fulfillment of the Law; It attunes you to your Maker, then your faith understanding - sets you free. I could not live as some - not by any means the poor or middle class, but the wealthiest of the wealthy - do, a prey to fear and anxiety, as unsure as if they had nothing. What does it profit a man if he gain the whole world and lose his own soul, that is if he has no emotional contact with his Creator? His life will be empty and unfulfilled. We are all told by our teachers that if we seek God first, work with Him, we can have whatsoever we desire, but very few understand this. I speak to people every day of my life, some of whom have been members of the School of Truth for thirty years and they still do not realise that they live, move and exist in the Spiritual presence which is the thinking Intelligence, the emotional feeling in their hearts, the life that courses through

their bloodstreams and abides in every cell of their bodies. It is THEMSELVES, not anything else. As the Master put it, "I in Thee and Thou in Me that we may be one in consciousness."

Our bodies are His storehouse, His powerhouse, His love, health, substance, prosperity, and our visible hands are what will release this good. Please think about this when you walk along, though falteringly, anxiously, yet WALK. Begin to do, to act, to BE. Let there be a little less praying and a little more doing. This is what God wants. Millions pray using the "vain repetitions" deplored by the Master. They give lip-service as they petition anxiously and fearfully with the result that nothing happens, because this is not how the Lord works. It is all according to our love, our consciousness of the outside manifestation we expect that it is done unto us. It is idle to blame God, or people, if things do not go right with you. Look into you own mind, heart and hands and note what you are giving. Remember when you are early. God has already anticipated your need, when you are on time He also is up to the minute, and when you are late He too is late. It is all very simple and straightforward so make it part of your daily awareness that your body is the temple of God, of His Mind, Soul and Spirit so that you can never, at any time, be separated from Him for this day, in this moment of fleeting time. He is fulfilled in you, through you and AS you.



Be of good cheer



How often in the Bible we are told to be cheerful! The Master said: "If ye keep my commandments, ye shall abide in my love; even as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in His love. These things have I spoken

unto you that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be made full." Obviously, His wish for His people was that they should be happy.

Actually to be cheerful is a duty, yet there are so many grumblers in the world. Think of the women who alienate their husbands and make their children miserable through constant nagging. Think of the number of men who have alienated their wives and families by their constant complaints and dissatisfaction with their lot. There are people who keep their charm for the stranger within their gates. Home to them is not a place for courtesy and consideration, but for bad temper and bad manners.

So many come to the School in search of happiness who have lost it through the obstacles encountered through marriage. Wives are dissatisfied with their husbands, and husbands with their wives. Usually they ask for prayers in order that this or that may be brought about, or that this or that one shall be changed. It seldom occurs to them that any change in themselves is desirable! They cannot regard themselves objectively enough to know that often they themselves need to alter their ways. It is a case of the mote and the beam. A nagging wife and a grumbling husband are failures in their most important roles in life. Is it surprising that so many homes are broken up? Is it strange that children leave the parental nest as soon as possible if there is no happiness to be found in it? Someone may say: "That's all very well, but you'd find it hard to be cheerful in my place." That may be so, but what is gained by being miserable? It does not help anything or anyone – indeed it makes everything infinitely worse.

We all know the person who looks on the gloomy side of life, and would avoid him if we could. The influence of people such as this is depressing. The popular ones are the optimists who "face the sunshine, that the shadows may fall behind."

The man who believes in Truth, and in God's unfailing love, knows that all things work together for ultimate good, and so he is cheerful. He realises that anything that is wrong in his life is not a punishment from God, but the result of his own wrong thoughts and actions which have not, in some way, conformed to the law of Love.

It would be good for each one of us to pause sometimes, and consider our attitude towards life, and things, and people. Are we grateful for what we have, or are we dissatisfied because others have more than we? Are we good-humoured, adding our quota to the joy of life, and lightening the burdens for those about us, or are we bad-tempered and morose? Those who make others unhappy deliberately, will have to suffer the consequences, for what we give we receive. They are not living according to the law of love, and some time and in some way they will have to pay for their wrong-doing. The laws of God are inflexible, and we disobey them at our cost.

Shall we not make up our minds that however ill-humoured we may have been in the past, from this time onwards we will be cheerful? We cannot have it both ways – we cannot call ourselves followers of Christ and spread misery about us. If we are true Christians we must do our best to lift up those who are in despair; inspire the hopeless; and shed happiness wherever we go.

Charles Kingsley wrote: "The men whom I have seen succeed best in life have always been cheerful and hopeful men, who went about their business with a smile on their faces, and took the changes and chances of this mortal life like men, facing rough and smooth alike as it came." And Carlyle said: "Give us the man who sings at his work! Be his occupation what it may, he is equal to any of those who follow the same pursuit in silent sullenness. He will do more in the same time – he will do it better – he will persevere longer."

Thoughts in a country garden



A couple of mornings ago, thinking of life in general and of my own life in particular, a certain sense of discouragement set in. Press and radio news was disconcerting, in the extreme, and I had quite a few urgent problems of my

own. On impulse I took a heavy, well-worn volume from one of the bookshelves, opened it at random, and one short, simple sentence caught my eye: "Everything necessary to my complete fulfillment is mine now." I read it over, two or three times. It was strangely satisfying, carrying as it did its own conviction which, however, I dismissed hastily because it seemed so groundless and irrational, and having a lot of things to see to I closed the book and started on my routine chores.

Ever this brief sentence recurred to me and I found myself unconsciously repeating it aloud. It came so "trippingly on the tongue" with no strain, no mental or emotional gymnastics, and without my giving it any specific thought.

Later on, in the afternoon, when I was sitting quietly in my favourite armchair, this affirmation again cropped up and I began to consider it. Why, I asked myself, should complete fulfillment be mine at a time when there were many things I wanted and definitely seemed to lack, and when my affairs in general needed quite a bit of straightening out? I knew enough of Truth to realise that only in God could all my needs be met, all my desires fulfilled, but what was He going to do about it? What was there in Him that could bring my All-good to pass? What sort of God was He, what was His Nature? Vaguely disturbed and restless, I let my mind wander idly and, unbidden, my thoughts turned in retrospect to the spacious, beautiful garden in which I grew up, and this is what I saw.

From the terrace I looked down onto one of the large emerald green lawns, and because it struck me how grass so continuously, irrespective of the rough treatment it suffers, renews itself, this spoke to me of livingness, vigour and vitality; the gorgeous flowering trees and shrubs, of endless variety, flowed with colour and spilled their fragrant perfume into the surround air. A chestnut with its tall, pure white candles was a thing of beauty, rich and rare; near to it stood the lilacs all aglitter with captured drops of recent rain, and because these shone and sparkled like cut diamonds they suggested wealth and prosperity to me. The syringe, bowed down with bridal blossoms, I just had to associate with love and happiness, as I did with joy and gladness the fluffy little buttons on the nearby double cherry that dangled on their slender stalks and swayed in the breeze. The majestic roses - red, yellow, white and orange – boldly displayed their brilliant hues and gaudy opulence, while the modest, gentle little primroses lifted their innocent faces to the glossy laurels, chroniclers of triumph and glory that gave them shelter from the sun. And further on the gigantic elms, with sturdy trunks and spreading branches, were the very essentials of strength and stability.

There was, of course, much more: orchards smothered in blossom or teeming with rosy fruit according to the season; vast vegetable beds laid out in rows, and as my eyes roved from one miracle of nature to another I recognised in each and every one the Omnipresence of God.

All the vibrant livingness was showing forth His Divine Qualities, and was telling me that, because I was one with Him, these attributes of youthfulness, beauty, health, vigour, vitality, joy, happiness, prosperity, gentleness, modesty, strength, stability, fruitfulness and order – and lots more – were mine. And remembering that "fulfillment was mine NOW." I accepted the Kingdom gladly, exultantly, and very humbly, for was I not just a small part of the mighty Whole that was not too vast, not too occupied with His far-flung universe to care for me?

The cosmos of which you are an integral, indispensable part is so constituted that it can refuse you nothing. Its business is to *give*, not to withhold; yours is to have the steadfast faith which takes and then shares in everlasting gratitude to the Giver who is Changeless LOVE and the FULFILMENT of His entire creation.

Tolerance



To me, the Master's message, "Judge not, that ye be not judged," urges tolerance. I sometimes wonder how many students of Truth have ever seriously considered the great importance of this quality of tolerance; and I wonder how many –

like myself – have gone their daily round with self-satisfied air, inwardly congratulating themselves on their elevated places on the Path of Attainment, when they were neglecting this most important of the Master's teachings. I have done it so I may reasonably presume that others have, for we all function in very much the same way. Tolerance is so very uncommon that it might be well to reverse the subject for a few lines, which brings us to a study of intolerance. Examples of this will probably be much more easily recognised.

Intolerance has an ugly habit of introducing itself into all kinds of situations in a very subtle manner indeed. It takes a great variety of forms and a still greater effort to eliminate them.

How often have you noticed how apt human beings are to criticise one another, and another's actions, opinions and manners?

Again there is the example of the biased person who will, not on provocation, but at every opportunity he can lay hands on, "call his brother a fool." Mr. Willie Tibbs has bought a new car. His "friend," Mr. Jimmy Bates, who probably knows nothing at all about the matter, disagrees with the make of that car. Thence the expression: "You're a fool to buy suchand-such a make." Now it should be fairly obvious that to think a person is a fool, let alone to go to the trouble of calling him one, is a sheer waste of valuable time. In the first place it is not polite; and in the second it is an expression of negativeness. You will easily appreciate that my thinking a man a fool is not going to make him one and that he is not going to agree with me in the least.

An earnest Truth student, reading this, should realise that one of his first duties is to mind his own business. "What is that to thee? Follow thou Me." Then should come the realisation that nobody has a right to express an opinion on another's actions unless expressly invited to do so. Sweep your own doorstep before you go about cleaning up your neighbour's back yard.

Anger is another emotion that is allied to fault-finding, and the pointed message to be found in Matthew 5:22, is, I think, that we should take as our first commandment the injunction to live in peace with all men and under no circumstances to regard anger as justifiable and never to look upon any human being as worthless or a fool. For, remember, we are all parts of the One Life.

To my mind, scandal and gossip are two other gross examples of intolerance. We all know the temptation to join in when we hear two people discussing a third unkindly. It is never done spitefully, oh dear, no; it's just digging out a few flaws in his character which we, with great discernment, have observed. I wonder who appointed us as judges? Conscience, which is a higher voice, seems to tell us that we are not doing the honourable thing and it is a voice that should be listened to more. A golden rule to cure this habit is: if you can't say anything good about a person, don't say anything at all.

There is another instance of intolerance that I have noticed hundreds of times in business. I have heard juniors cursed – literally cursed – at for making some trifling mistake. I do not think any man is justified in shouting and swearing at another, even if he makes an enormous error. Nobody makes mistakes on purpose, and if it is done in carelessness he should be gently encouraged to be more careful. The cause should be investigated tolerantly, not the effect stormed at blindly. To yell and scream at him will only be responded to by resentment. The error might have been made in ignorance, for it is clear that a person working a year cannot have the same discretionary ability as one working twenty. There is no person with any claims to intelligence who expects children in grade seven to pass a matriculation paper. And so it is with Life.

We are all at school – God's School; some are in the lower forms and some are in the higher. Our duty is to exercise tolerance towards our brothers and sisters in the lower classes and to learn from those higher than ourselves. We should feel within ourselves an element of true humility and know that our opinions are by no means as important to others as they are to us. Every man is to himself the very centre of the universe, and nothing that we can do, shout at him as we will, is going to change him in five minutes.

A harassed business man who shouts at his juniors and hurl papers around to show his importance may read this and scoff at it as the wanderings of a theoretical visionary. He may say, "That's all very well, but I've got to see that this job is done and done quickly." My friend, reflect a little. It may be an important job, but in the final issue much does not depend upon it. Remember, the world has gone on for millions of years and is very likely to go on for a few more. Don't be in too much of a hurry. You've got eternity to do it in.

An attitude of tolerance is achieved by some in small matters who fail rather badly in large. It is of no use being tolerant with your children and friends alone, you have to be tolerant with the people and opinions you don't like into the bargain. There are thousands of good people on this fair earth of ours who will look very tolerantly on the opinions of those in their own circle, religion, creed or politics, but become screeching furies when confronted with those of others equally entitled to a hearing. This reminds me of a parallel I read of some time ago of the armies of old (and today, too, for that matter) that used to pray to God for success in a campaign to overcome His enemies, forgetting that their opponents were doing exactly the same thing to a God who loved them both. Were they not both parts of God?

And so we come to the larger issues of tolerance and intolerance, and when we can find the Christ-like attitude in these, the little disagreements of families and our immediate environment will fade into nothingness. We must realise that all human actions take their origin from one incentive – the Quest for Happiness, in which man has been joined with man, without regard to caste, color, or creed since the dawn of his evolution. We must sweep aside all prejudice. God made His sun to shine on both the just and the unjust. The bad and the good are fundamentally united in a brotherhood and are looking for the same thing though in different ways. And it is only through taking wrong ways as means of expression that the transgressor will find the right one – the Truth.

When we can conceive and hold fast to this conception of tolerance error will no longer seem bad. We will know that the perfect man stands, eternally strong, behind the appearance of error, and that the so-called transgressor is not really such but is merely undergoing an experience that will bring him nearer to the Truth and God's Divine purpose. This realisation will, by a natural association, bring ourselves in equal degree nearer to God in consciousness.

Thus it is easy to see that thoughts of anger, criticism, resentment and fault-finding will never cure a fault. In fact,

love is the only force that can cure anything. If we send out negative thoughts to another we will be responded to by negative thoughts and they will harm us more than the person they go to. It requires only a very elementary knowledge of Truth to know that negative thinking will never change anybody for the Good. Whereas if we send constructive thoughts, we may rest assured that straight and as unerring as the flight of an arrow, the message is registered on the consciousness of the recipient and he is helped. Now, perhaps, we can see that to indulge in negative thoughts of intolerance is the very opposite of serving God – we are hindering the process of evolution and willfully abusing that wonderful gift – creative thought. So the words of the Master ring through the centuries: "He that is without error, let him cast the first stope!"



Our neighbour

What is meant by our neighbour we cannot doubt; it is everyone with whom we are brought into contact. First of all, he is literally our neighbour who is next to us in our own family and household; husband to wife, wife to husband, parent to child, brother to sister. Then it is he who is close to us in our own neighbourhood, in our own town, in our own parish, in our own street. With these all true charity begins. To love and be kind to these is the very beginning of all true religion. But, besides these, as our Lord teaches, it is everyone who is thrown across our path by the changes and chances of life; he or she, whosoever it be, whom we have any means of helping – the unfortunate stranger whom we may meet in travelling, the deserted friend whom no one else care to look after.
