Gratitude



All of us are enjoined by the Psalmist "to rejoice and give thanks," and when we advise students who have come to us with serious problems to do this they immediately retort, "For what reason should I give thanks? The Master's teaching on the subject of Love does not work for me, or for the majority of Christians, some of whom are poor, others failures,

while still others are miserable and live in shattered homes. What have we to rejoice about?"

When at the outset of my Truth-life I waited two weary years for my first demonstration I asked myself that same question. I felt that I was sincere, I thought I was leading my life as it should be led, yet there appeared to be no response from God, no deliverance, guidance, no vision.

The Psalmist, who went through many troubles, had great difficulties to face, but he did have wonderful demonstrations, although often only at the eleventh hour. He was certainly a man of understanding and that made me wonder if there were not something in this giving of thanks. Did God have to be placated, or did we, when sick, poverty-stricken and unhappy, have to make a pretence of enjoying harmony and wellbeing? Where

did spiritual understanding come in as, with artificial smiles, one gave thanks for nothing?

I am an alert individual for it is my business to observe people, to mark the kind of lives they live—whether these are healthy, happy and prosperous—and to take note of their demonstrations. It occurred to me that perhaps this great Jew had discovered something, and I decided to try it by myself giving thanks believing that the Presence of Goodness, which was aware of my needs, was also willing and able to fulfil them. Of course I recognized that it would not be enough to walk about saying "Thank you, thank you" or even to sing songs and hymns; it was the inner feeling that had to be stimulated. And while it was difficult to be enthusiastic over something, one could not see, touch or feel, one could perhaps work up a feeling of warmth and expectancy. I made up my mind to accept that the good I craved was not about to be, but was currently mine; that God was at that moment releasing me from the bondage of my problems.

Though no change took place I began to feel happy; yet the more I thanked God, the worse things became until they reached the point of crisis and my reaction was, "Is this how God blesses me and lifts my burdens from me?" I wondered if I were fooling myself or if my gratitude was not sincere enough. I asked to be shown if, and where, I was wrong, or if I had to increase my gratitude for what was yet unmanifest.

It then happened that I was asked to drive a woman to visit a great friend who appeared to be dying. I was taken into the room

with her where a doctor was sitting beside the patient. Looking at his watch he said, "We shall know in an hour or two, when she reaches the point of crisis, whether she will recover or pass on." It seemed as we waited that she was sinking ever lower and lower, life appeared gradually to be flickering out, but when the critical moment arrived she began to rally and the doctor said "That's fine. She has stopped short of the point of no return and will live."

I thought very deeply about this, for in it was my answer. God had been talking to me, showing me that things at first often get worse and worse, and that it is then that we either fail or negotiate the obstacle and begin to build up again.

That was what was happening in my life. Things were becoming chronic and I wondered if there were something in my consciousness that had to be eliminated. Then the words "You can't put new wine into old bottles" came into my mind and I realized that one cannot put a new awareness into an old one any more than one can put new seats into a theatre before first taking out those that are already there. A similar process of removal was happening to me. A change was taking place as my health, happiness and finances deteriorated in order to be renewed and rehabilitated. The old bottles were being replaced, the old consciousness was being cleansed, and a struggle was going on between the thoughts that were being cast out and the concepts that were flooding in. It was a Process reminiscent of the making of lemonade: you

put two substances together, there is a great commotion and when that subsides you have a pleasant beverage.

My body temple was in the state in which that woman had been when I visited her. My passenger, I and the doctor could do nothing; we could only sit and watch until she was over the hurdle, after which she recovered completely.

This was long before the School of Truth existed, but it changed my artificial gratitude into the real thing. I realized that I had nothing to fear, that God was All-power, All-knowledge, the only Presence permeating all things and that everything that was not of Him was a lie that could not persist.

Even while the fight between the inner and the outer was in progress I was able joyously to give thanks that the Presence of God was refining me, cleansing me of all my negative thoughts and emotions, so making His temple a worthy repository of His Divine ideas. It followed that all my problems were naturally, not super-naturally, resolved. Had it not been so the School of Truth would never have developed.

Because you cannot read the writing on the wall you miss wonderful happenings and answers to prayer which you do not recognize as such. You question, wonder, fear, but if you had seen all that I have seen in my own life and the lives of hundreds of others who were going through deep waters, you would know that there is

nothing of which mankind need be afraid. Problems we shall always have and because our human minds, our friends, associates, ministers and teachers do not know how to overcome them, we panic.

As I have so often told you, the blockage is in consciousness. It is not an outside phenomenon; and because love is the fulfilment of the Law, to release it is to set free the God-power that resides in you and me AS us. There are no reservations, everything is present awaiting man's acceptance of it. The Kingdom of God is here and now manifest, but man, who is wearing blinkers, says, "That is an untruth for I see poverty, disease, unhappiness and frustration. There is no God in His world in which all is said to be well, but in which all is amiss." Such folk are looking into the old bottles that are full of sediment and are seeing only that. They do not see as God does, with eyes that are too pure to behold iniquity, whose Vision is uncontaminated and wholly trustworthy. Only the eye of the spiritually awakened can clearly perceive the Divine Beauty, Health, Happiness and Goodness that are everywhere present in the place where adverse conditions, circumstances and situations are claiming to hold sway.

When I began wholeheartedly to give thanks I started to see correctly. Is this too difficult for you to do? Can you not develop a little right thinking and feeling within yourself? It should not be beyond you if that is what you really want; but if you only listen to me and our other teachers who give

you the Vision of the School of Truth and its many years of demonstration and do not hear the message, how can you benefit from the teaching?

You have deliberately become a part of the consciousness of the School of Truth for you are the School. We are only your leaders telling you of what is daily taking place in our lives and in those of students the world over. We share with you the letters we receive, the telephone calls that come through, the problems that are put up to us and the rejoicing and gratitude that follow, from folk who are not clever or brilliant but who are able with humility to accept. Have you anything to lose?

Two or three weeks ago I spoke to you of my reasons for believing in God, then I told you why I give to Him, and after that why I rejoice in Him. That is all I practise, believing, giving and gratitude. With all my mind, heart and soul I believe that the spirit of God is within man, NOT in separation from this loving Presence that constitutes me and every aspect of my life. Because of that belief I give gladly and continuously, rejoicing in the conviction that His Vision, Guidance and Direction are ever within me. These, for me, are Realities, so like the Psalmist I can rejoice and give thanks, can sing a song of Praise unto His Name. This is what we would have you do without further waste of time. If you are a trifle sceptical, if my explanation of Truth seems to you somewhat simple, think back to the words of Emerson. He was one of the greatest Truth thinkers of all time, a man who made all high-sounding

language and phraseology seem like mere word-catching, and he pronounced the essence of Truth to be simplicity.

I am a man going on for 65, still as childlike in my approach today as I was nearly forty years ago, and still with a heart filled with gratitude. It is not that I am unaware of conditions, circumstances and problems. They present themselves to me just as they do to you, but I see them merely as little incidents of resistance which help to build up the awareness of the individual. They wake you up, compel you to put forth more effort as they challenge the sincerity of your belief in your Creator. I am talking not of trust, faith, wisdom, knowledge, understanding, but of your childlike belief in your Maker.

The other day a lady said to me, "My friend thinks I am quite mad to come to see you because you are yourself mad." And I replied, "Thank your friend for saying that I am mad. I would rather be mad, having what I have and being what I am, than sane having what she has and being what she is. I am better off in every way so let me continue in my madness. Let me live in my world of childlikeness and gather in the handsome dividends it pays."

It works for me, it works for you, it works for humanity at large. Unfortunately people like to make things complicated, to work with abstractions which most of us do not understand. If you cannot resolve the simple problems connected with

health, happiness and security, the more intricate ones will surely baffle you. Those who are incapable of doing simple sums will certainly not be able to tackle the differential calculus. Similarly, no one can play an easy piece of music who is completely ignorant of the principles of harmony. Understanding is of the essence, and gratitude follows upon it.

Solomon declared "as a man thinketh in his heart so is he," and do not forget that thinking can be both positive and negative. Without feeling you cannot demonstrate, but with 99% of people their feelings are those of negation, of sorrow, hatred, resentment, bitterness which we see reflected in their bodies and affairs. They envy those who – having a simple understanding of God – express love and gratitude which bring in their train bodily health, emotional happiness, and material security.

If today you would enter into your heritage of All-good let the following be your affirmation: "I will rejoice and give thanks that God is fulfilled in me, through me, and AS me as whatsoever I desire."

First things first

The majority of people do not put the most important things first. They think more of material things than of those of the Spirit, and yet only the latter are realities because they are the only things that have lasting value.

It is bad enough that adults should feel this way, but it is even worse when they force their children to follow in their footsteps. How many young people, gifted in some way, have through the influence of their parents or guardians set aside their gifts and devoted their lives to doing something in which they have no interest? How often has a young man who felt an urge to enter the church been told: "There's no money in it." How often has a young man or woman who wanted to be an artist been told the same thing? And if they are influenced, they probably spend their lives doing work for which they have little or no liking instead of following their own particular star.

The things of the world so often draw us away from our high ideals, and our fears blur their outlines. Because we have not learnt to look to God for our supply, instead of to man, we are afraid of not making a living, perhaps, or not being able to have all the good things we desire. Maybe love of money makes us forget that we should put the Kingdom of God before all else; or possibly the wish to occupy some high position blinds us to the importance of spiritual values.

Let us not allow anything to deflect us from any high purpose we may have in view. Let us be loyal to our highest ideals that we may be loyal to God. If we are doing what we know to be right, and our trust is in Him, He will not fail us. He has provided for all our needs in His Kingdom and our faith brings His supply into manifestation. But we must be sure that what we want is also what He wants for us. Actually, there is no necessity for us to tell Him what we need, for He knows it better than we do ourselves; and He has promised that if we will seek first His Kingdom, all else shall be added unto us – but so many of us are lacking in faith. Perhaps we trust Him in some things and not in others.

Let us remember that it is not enough to put first things first in our minds only. To have ideals indestructible and glorious is no use unless we work hard and make every effort to achieve them. We must be workers as well as thinkers – doers of the Word and not hearers only. But the dream must come first. Imagination is creative and, as Charkes Morgan says, when we imagine with love we create what we imagine, and what we then create has real and extending value. Many of us, however, through using imagination in the wrong way, bring into materialisation those things which have no true worth. If we use our imagination to achieve great wealth, we shall probably attain it, especially if we make all our other efforts concentrate on this one desire. But this is worshipping mammon instead of God – putting the wrong thing first, which will bring us no real joy.

We may meditate daily and attend lectures or church regularly, but unless our philosophy of life enters into everything we think, say, and do, we are not giving first place to the most important things. Our religion must be part of us.

Let us learn to use imagination in the right way. Let us create with love – use our thoughts to bring us those things which are beyond price – use it to make the world a more beautiful and more pleasant place to live in. And to give something to mankind which will be of lasting worth. Earthly treasures may give us a great deal of pleasure, but pleasure is not the same as joy. Pleasure comes from without, but joy from within. It is an attitude of mind – a thing of the spirit. We know happiness when we put the most important things before all else – when we live according to the law the Master came to earth to teach. When we put love first, all other things are added unto us, for when we truly love we cannot offend God or man.

A new outlook

What a wonderful transformation would take place on earth if children the world over were taught to think constructively as naturally as they learn the letters of the alphabet and the rules of simple arithmetic.

When we realise that everything stems from THOUGHT does not it seem odd that so little attention is given to this vital factor? We are told so often that the essence of Truth is simplicity, but however simple it is, it must be translated into ACTION before any change can take place; and if the habit of CONSTRUCTIVE THINKING is to be established it follows that errors in the form of negative attitudes and reactions must be eliminated before they are allowed to take up their abode in our consciousness.

When a child begins to read he makes mistakes, but he is corrected and must repeat the word again and again until he has it right. It is impossible to estimate what a valuable lesson would be learnt if this line of reasoning was given a little consideration. A new outlook is long overdue and the one mentioned would make a sound foundation on which to build a happier world.

While it is harder for adults than children to acquire new habits nothing is impossible if our desire is sincere and our heart is in the job. Many parents are concerned - and with good reason – about their children's future, especially if they appear to have lost contact with them. A new outlook on their part could well be the means of bringing them together again if the parents realised they had been given a second chance and would seek God's guidance.

One of the first books I read on Truth lines was called HE CAN WHO THINKS HE CAN. It made a deep impression on my mind, and if we would set out to prove that statement of Truth each day the striking effect on our personalities would be so strong that our friends and relations would remark on the change.

A new outlook will avail us nothing so long as it remains a theoretical 'hope!' It must be translated into action to become effective. How is this to be done? I would suggest that instead of regarding difficulties as obstacles on our path – with all kinds of aggravation clinging to them – we see them as challenges, the over-coming of which takes us forward in our spiritual development. This attitude, coupled with a sense of humour, helps us to see things in their right perspective and, if we are honest with ourselves, often reveals how easy it is for us to make mountains out of mole-hills.

A new outlook demands that we meet experiences rather than run away from them. The thing is to keep an open mind, be ready to listen to new ideas, for they may well lead to something to our advantage. Time passes quickly these days. Many folk find it hard to forget past mistakes. The new outlook teaches us to learn from them, and so we discover they were really friends in disguise. Remembering that God has given all His children a wonderful mental garden to cultivate, it is up to us to pull up the weeds of negation which slipped into our minds when we were not looking and replace them with constructive thoughts. The following four lines put the whole thing into a nutshell:

Sow a thought – reap an action;

Sow an action – reap a habit;

Sow a habit – reap a character;

Sow a character – reap a destiny.

Trust God

It is not enough for thinking people to be told about God and the many blessings which come as the result of faith. The person with an alert mind needs to prove these things for himself

Often people do not take much interest in religion while their lives are running smoothly, and it is only when some trouble comes upon them which they as human beings cannot overcome, that they turn to God. Possibly they become ill, or one near and dear to them becomes ill, and they are filled with fear. If the sickness does not respond to treatment they probably feel the need of help from some higher Power in spite of the fact that in the past they have thought little about God.

On the other hand they may be in financial difficulties from which they see no possibility of extricating themselves. Or perhaps there is inharmony in their personal relationships. Any number of things may cause men at last to seek God.

What a pity it is that they so often wait until a tragedy overtakes them before learning how to live! Trials there must be, of course, for they are necessary to our growth and teach us the stuff of which we are made; but those without faith suffer far more than those who possess it. Faith enables us to rise above sorrow and surmount difficulties. It prevents us from becoming submerged in grief or some other trouble. It gives us strength to endure.

Faith also enables us to achieve our aims. If we have sufficient, we can do what we want to do and be what we want to be within the Law. We are the result of our own thoughts, and if we have sufficient faith and our desire is sufficiently urgent we can be successful, though it should be remembered that success does not always lie in achievement. The scientist may not always see the results of his experiments, but if he has paved the way for those who will follow has he not succeeded?

We have all heard of happenings that are called miracles, and some of us have probably experienced such things ourselves. Actually, the Universe is ruled by Law, and just because we do not know how to apply the Law we talk of miracles. A doctor may be amazed at the (to him) unexplainable recovery of a patient who appeared to be beyond aid. Yet in the Bible we are told that the supplication of a righteous man availeth much; and that the prayer of faith shall save him who is sick. Need we then regard it as a miracle if a man is cured by prayer? Jesus said to the people of His day that according to their faith it was done unto them, and that is as true today as when He spoke the words.

Someone has said that spirituality is not something to be, but something to do. And there is something to do to acquire faith if we do not possess it – faith, which is the essence of spirituality. If you would acquire it, act as if you possessed it,

and if you would increase it make use of what you have, however little it may be. Prove it by behaving as if you had all the faith you needed. As we think, so we are, therefore think in terms of 'I believe', not in terms of 'I do not believe'. There is power in thought and there is power in the spoken word, so think and speak in terms of SPIRITUAL Truth. Our thoughts go out into the ether and attract others similar to themselves, thus taking us into that particular vibration. Do you not see how that benefits us if our thoughts are constructive, and how it can harm us if they are destructive? Thought is creative, and if we think in terms of goodness, truth, and beauty, those are the conditions we can expect to manifest for us.

Living in the Presence

She was, it seemed, beginning to go deaf, so –feverishly – she started working for a demonstration of the perfect hearing that was all too evidently slipping away. She continued her efforts for some weeks under ever-mounting tension, and there was of course (as she was filled with fear) no improvement. If anything, the trouble appeared to be getting worse.

Then one day as she was about to begin her meditation (followed by the usual urgent affirmations) a rather startling thought struck her and she asked herself, "Am I, by any chance, imagining that GOD is going deaf? If I am not, where is my own deafness coming from? Obviously God, who knows nothing of negation, cannot be visiting upon me. There is also no power apart from Him that could be bringing it forth, and it cannot have caused itself, so it must have taken its rise in some unrecognized dark patch in my own consciousness which, at the moment, I cannot trace."

That was enough to start her on a completely new direction. She decided that, despite what she was experiencing, her hearing was intact (did not the Bible say something about God's ears not being "stopped"?) and resolutely she gave up all declarations and petitioning. Instead, she set herself the task of living in the PRESENCE of her Maker, and of attuning herself to Him.

Immediately she found that she dared no longer look askance at the tramp in the street, the drunkard reeling along in the gutter, the occasional urchin who threw a stone at a dog since all, no matter how unlikely this appeared, must be God's children, beloved of Him. He had created the warthog, the deadly mamba, the toad and the slimy slug, if these – to her – repulsive creatures could be dear to Him, how much more would He not cherish the tramp, the drunkard and the mischievous small boy – the so-called riff raff she was venturing to despise? For God, she realized there are no good and bad, no ruly or unruly, worthy and despicable; on all His love is poured out freely for did not the Christ say, "Whatsoever ye do unto the least of these little ones, ye do also unto Me"?

We believe that students of Truth should make their daily life reflect their beliefs and faith. One way of doing this is to choose an idea or affirmation which can be thought of during the waking hours, perhaps the affirmation offered in the daily thoughts.

"THE PATH" provides a number of guidelines some of which may help one to focus in a spare moment of time:

- 9. If people appear to misunderstand, misjudge or mistreat us, readily forgive them, beholding Love (God) in each individual concerned.
- Instead of looking at our employers, our debtors or other human sources, we look directly to Truth in us for our supply.

"I will restore the years"

No matter what devastation and chaos is expressed in our bodies and lives because of our SEPARATION IN CONSCIOUSNESS FROM GOD, HARMONY, it is written, "I will restore the years that the locust hath eaten", and "Behold, I make all things new." This applies to the material as well as to the physical side of life.

I have known a friend, who had become a self-made millionaire, lose everything including, through illness, his wife, start again from scratch, become affluent a second time, again lose the lot, and start for the third time from the beginning, when in his sixties and with a new wife at his side – an adorable woman. He is now, only a couple of years later, well on his way to complete financial recovery and success. It took courage, lots of it, an attitude of "None of these things moves me", and a very loving nature.

I believe that it is fear of the effects of time and not time itself that causes premature aging and drastic aging of the body, and it is not only fear of the effects of time but all fear and anxiety that tear down the cells of the body; and who amongst us has known fear and anxiety in varying degrees, if not yourselves then for others? I need not mention hatred, jealousy, bitterness, rancour, etc. for the effects of these noxious emotions are well known and constantly brought to the attention of Truth students.

"Perfect love casteth out fear", so those who would experience youthful vitality, and even beauty, or at least a measure of these throughout their lives, should strive to express more and more of this life-giving and renewing love which will restore harmony and order to the cells and tissues of their bodies. Is God capable of renewing only some cells and not others, those ravaged by illness perhaps, but not by age? Why this imposition of limitation?

If the ageing of the body were the result of the working of a predetermining law, then, all law being immutable and changeless like the laws of mathematics, electricity and gravity, everyone without exception should at a certain age start this degeneration process, and yet we see some people begin to age as young as thirty years, whereas others much later on in life.

"God is the same yesterday, today and forever", and when we cease to limit Him we will cease to experience limitation in our bodies and affairs. The human body should go on developing until maturity is reached and then remain at this stage of development until it passes on when the soul's new form will vibrate at a rate no longer visible to the optical organs with which we observe phenomena on the earth plane.

For the soul is form and doth the body make." This applies not only to this plane of consciousness but to all subsequent planes. Approximately between 1920 and 1940 there were in India, high up in the mountains, men of over 100 years old who were attracting scientific research because they were still doing a full day's physical work, getting married and fathering children. I read in our own newspaper a couple of years ago that there is a woman in South Africa of 132 years of age. I have not read the book, but I have read about the book written by a doctor in America about the fallacies of old age, and he is tearing down certain myths one after the other.

When I was in King's Canyon National Park in America, I stood there before the oldest of the giant Redwood trees and gazed in awe and wonder at the splendour and majesty of this erect old man whom they have named General Grant. His brother have long since died and there he stands, between 3,000 and 3,500 years old, as tall and straight as he was in his youth, and a monument to the immortality of Life and to God's promise; "I will restore the years that the locust hath eaten."
