

Steadfastness

"Be not weary in well doing for, in due time, ye shall reap if ye faint not." – St Paul.



I admit that it is no easy matter to continue in "well doing" when adverse conditions persist, and God appears to be receding further and further into the background and there is no sign that He is doing anything for the one who is trying to rely solely upon Him.

We are all tested at one time or another in this way and the Truth teacher is no exception, and it often happens that he resents it more than does the man in the street. This is quite understandable for he feels that, putting himself last and devoting, as he does, his life and nearly all his time to the unselfish service of God and man, he should be spared distressing personal experiences. But these are as necessary to him as they are to other people for, even though he is working with the abstract spiritual Law, that is not a person with the power of choice, he too must never lose sight of the fact that he is made in the image and likeness of the Father.

If you examine Truth as taught by others and us you will see that It works for the individual regardless of the religious group to which he belongs. Most religions, Roman Catholic, Jewish, Christian Science, Methodist, Anglican,

Baptist and many, many others claim that they alone have found the consciousness of God; that this is exclusive to them and that unless you accept their approach and the particular interpretation that they have placed upon the Scriptures you shall in no wise enter the Kingdom of Heaven.

They remind you of the Master's words, "By their works shall ye know them," and each denomination points to results, saying "Look how our God heals our people," and they claim Him as specifically their own, forgetting that it is neither creed, ceremony nor ritual that works through the individual and awakens him to that indwelling Presence of God that alone constitutes his health, happiness and supply; but that indefinable "something." That white light of Truth, that shining ray that permeates every man and every organisation and is called FAITH. The unbeliever who, without any understanding of God, consciously accepts good, can have precisely the same demonstrations as the student of Truth.

Because I see the presence of God as good flowing through my life I do not say that I, alone, am right and everyone else is wrong; I merely claim that it is according to my Faith – as it is to theirs – that it is done unto them and me. I do not attribute His manifestation in and through anybody to particular observances like the clapping of hands or the sign of the Cross; neither in my own case do I feel that I, and those who follow what I teach, are the only ones who have actually found God. I know that the blessings that are showered upon s come to us solely because we have touched

the inner spiritual man that, oblivious of class and creed, knows himself *only* as the Spirit of God, manifesting in and through every individual in the world.

It would be just as simple for me to become an orthodox minister, to accept whatever ritual and ceremony were entailed, and still see in manifestation the identical Presence of God I see today, and the same holds good for all spiritual leaders; it is nothing but their *Faith* in God that does the works and is the living spark that animates their particular teaching.

We of the School of Truth do not censure or condemn our fellow religionists. We appreciate the Presence of God manifesting through all people, we see good in all mankind, but we do feel that Truth broadens, is all-embracing, and that It does not bind, but on the contrary sets FREE all who adhere to it.

And now to revert to our opening injunction: "Be not weary in well doing for, in due time, you shall reap if you faint not." I want to ask you to answer the following questions in your hearts. Have you actually accepted the Reality and Omnipresence of God, the Truth that He is infinite, is Love and Knowledge, and is the only Power and Presence, so that nothing can thwart His purpose, and do you believe that any condition or circumstance that is unlike Him is but an appearance, a *lie* that has been conjured up and accepted by the human consciousness?

I am sure that you have answered in the affirmative. You believe there is no power that can oppose God, that as He

is Omnipresence, permeating all space, He must be in every adverse condition, whether of disease, unhappiness or lack, so that these cannot be truths, but are errors of mortal thought that accepts the absence of their opposite good, which absence is an impossibility in a God-filled universe.

We are created in His image and likeness, facsimiles of Intelligence, Beauty, Love and Truth; we can lack nothing of any kind, so what is it that holds up our good, where is the obstruction that prevents the manifestation of health through our bodies, happiness in our hearts and affluence in our affairs?

If God is everywhere evenly present He must live, move and exist through us; if He is Love He must want these qualities to express for us, and if He is Knowledge He knows how to bring this to pass, and the fact that He is omnipotent permits Him to enforce His will. But – He is limited, *prescribed within the precincts of our consciousness of Him*, hence St Paul's admonition not to be weary in well doing for, in due time, *when our awareness has expanded, we shall reap if we faint not.*

What is our first reaction when we start working with Truth? We expect prosperity to pour into our lives, disease to be wiped out of our bodies, discord to be eliminated from our lives and peace to flow into our hearts. We look, and hope for, immediate demonstrations and become over-anxious and tense so that our concern constricts the channels through which the spiritual Power of God would stream through us, and we become like those of whom Jesus spoke in His parable of the sower and

the seed. Some of us sow upon stony ground or among weeds, and do not receive, only those who sow on good ground, in the Spirit of Love, reap a harvest. These do not concentrate upon "getting"; they know that to do so is to put the cart before the horse. They realise that before one can take out of life one must have put something into it so they persist in their constructive endeavours; they are not weary in well doing.

Conditions and appearances often seem to be insurmountable. I personally have neither the strength nor the courage to overcome certain of them, and I do not expect this of you either. I have likened myself and my dependence upon God to a child with a nursery governess, I look to Him, as a child might, for every little thing in my life and when He eludes me I become perturbed until I realise that He is not absent from me but is ever present within me; then I know that it does not matter how black appearances may become or how solidified negative conditions, for as I remember that He is all-in-all and compel myself to recognise that this is true, I know that I can take my active steps in Faith and that He will honour these eliminating from my life whatever is at odds with Himself.

I keep on, but look at the majority! They are enthusiastic for a week or a month, all is for the moment right with their world and when the results they are looking for are held up, do they continue to believe that God is working for them, has already created, and is causing to be brought into manifestation, the qualities that they desire? NO, they do not! They give up and say that it does not work for them.

That is not my attitude. As I understand it God's universe is finished. The good is not *going* to be created, it is established and done, and there is nothing that you or I can desire but it is already in fulfilment. It is we who deprive ourselves because we have not the courage to persist, but continue to accept conditions as realities and to look for channels rather than to Him for their removal.

I never found it easy to close my eyes to appearances and to know that within me is my health, my happiness and my prosperity. It is, of course, difficult with the negative conditions before you and around you to see it through. We want to know *how*, and *when*, and it is no simple thing to take the long-term view. We ask ourselves what the results will be of seeking the consciousness of the Presence of God with such persistency of purpose.

Let me tell you that one of the first will be the elimination from your hearts of all fear, the dread of sickness, unhappiness, defeat and insecurity. That alone is a priceless gift! You will be free, free from the dominance of people, conditions and circumstances; you will *know* for the first time that truly the Father within, the Spirit of Good, of Love abiding in you, doeth the works. We cannot bring things forth for ourselves, we can but trust and take whatever practical measures are indicated. I cannot tell you how the matter will be resolved. You may be taken to the very brink, to the last second of time when you feel that failure is inevitable, but I have

never known God to be too late or to deprive anyone, myself included, of one atom of good.

Whenever you are prepared to trust God and are ready to go ahead in the face of conditions, you will find that He will not compel you to renounce your good. On the contrary, to show His love for you He will pour out more and more of His bounty upon you.

Not everybody has this courage, and it is understandable. We cannot see God, touch Him, or – at times – even *sense* His goodness, but where would the merit, the virtue be, if we did not need to have Faith, which is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things unseen.

When we know we have Faith we do not say, "I know it will come into being, it will manifest now or then." We affirm, "Here IS my Faith, the substance, from *sub* meaning under and stance – to stand, i.e. that which stands under or is the spiritual foundation of the concrete thing." That is the *solid* kind of Faith that is not afraid of criticism, that can face conditions, yet is ready to brave ridicule and scorn, It is not the sort that sets its teeth and says: "I must prove this before I can pass it on to the others, so I *want* results! God, give me these that I may compel those around me to believe me."

Such a stand is wrong, and is the very attitude that will prevent you from finding the consciousness of God, for what have you or I to do with *people*? We must live naturally with the Father, fearlessly not fearfully. Once you have understood

the principles involved in working with Him and the fact that in Truth there is no failure, whether it be health, happiness or prosperity that you are seeking; if you follow the mechanics of demonstration, as surely as the answer to any mathematical problem exists, so surely will you be able to write FINISHED to your spiritual problem – if you persist, and are not weary in well doing.

It takes a lot of courage, a lot of vision, but it is worth it. That is the point that I am always stressing. I always ask myself of what value is this or that to me? Will the finding of the Presence of God as Knowledge, Power and Protection pay for the effort entailed? I think we are all sufficiently intelligent to answer that question with a very decided "Yes" and to realise that it is worth all the money in the world, all the material gifts that could ever be bestowed upon us. The spiritual consciousness of God arises not in the intellect but in the heart, and one finds a greater Faith among women than among men because women's feelings go deeper than men's and so bring them closer to God. It is the soul of man that is the abiding place of God, as a man thinketh (or feeleth) in his heart, so is he, or so does he become. There are men who feel, until things go wrong, that religion is something for weak women and young children, but when their dreams are shattered and their health fails, when unhappiness sets in and poverty stalks them, as a last resort they turn to God.

That is the most intelligent thing that anyone can do, for to believe in Him is to believe in a scientific principle of good, in the spiritual and the physical self, in the Power that can overcome any and every condition. It brings an inner peace, the realisation that it is God's province, not our own, to solve our difficulties for us when we put our trust in Him. It strengthens us with the knowledge that He cannot fail, that our bodies are His temples, maintained and sustained by Him, and that all our fellowmen are channels of His good.

If this is true of everyone we meet then surely the more love we give to those around us the more will flow back to us as health, protection and prosperity.

There is one thing connected with Truth about which I would like to give you some advice.

It often happens when a student begins to set Truth principles into operation that everything goes awry. He has then entered upon a period of what we call "spiritual chemicalisation." It is a refining process, a clearing out of the old, false negative thoughts, a building within of a spiritual temple through which God can manifest; the opening of the sluicegates so that His indwelling attributes of All-good can flow from the inner to the outer and express in the individual's visible world. It is often accompanied by an apparent worsening of conditions. If you are sick, you become sicker; if you are unhappy, the unhappiness increases; if you lack, even more lack seems to come along. This is nothing to be afraid of, it is something you should welcome. It is a clearing of the terrain, the weeds in the garden are being eradicated and the negative thoughts in your minds are being obliterated.

Once and for all it is being brought home to you that you must give up your fear, cease to entertain doubts and consequently also to look for results. Now is the time to take stock of yourselves, to examine your motives, to ask yourselves what is your vision of God? How do you feel about Him, about your own hearts? How are you using your hands in His service? No *man* can give you health or happiness; these are a state of mind, a subjective realisation, the awareness that the Presence of God fills the outer body with perfection, the inner heart with happiness and the waiting, empty hands with prosperity.

If any of you have a lack-consciousness and your hands are closed in fear, every hand will be shut to you. There is but one spiritual hand, the Hand of God; just as there is but one body though many organs, if only an extremity is injured the whole is affected. If you hold on to nothingness, if you cherish a "have-not consciousness" lack will be fulfilled in your bodies and affairs. You must let go of your tensions, your criticisms and failure, insecurity and want. If you are prepared merely to exist, to live half a life, that is your personal choice, it is not God's. The earth is the Lord's, and the fullness thereof, and there is enough of His good to pour into your lives and to fill them full, so that you have as much as you could possibly desire. To His riches there is no limit for they are infinite.

Remember therefore to be not weary in well doing for before you called God had answered; all your good was already established within you, and if you hold on to the

Truth, you shall reap, if you faint not. When you, the physical, are weak, you, the spiritual, are strong. It does not matter how depleted your bodies become, you are only as strong as the flesh, but that is not what you are depending on. You are relying on the Spirit of God, the unseen, intangible but noble Spirit within you, that constitutes all of your minds, bodies and affairs. Stop searching for results, casting about for channels, depending upon persons, property and position. Begin to look only to God, the Spirit of Love. If you would understand Love, think of the love of husbands for wives, wives for children, of sisters for brothers; think of the deep affection that exists between close friends. Lump all of this together and compare it with the Infinite of Love that is God. It is on *This* that you are planting your Faith; it is This that is trying to find expression through you, that is yearning to fill your bodies with radiant health, your hearts with golden peace, your affairs with abundant prosperity. All of this is yours when you can earn it, when you have learned to become it. And when you have learned this you will no longer be able not to give it! Verily, you shall reap, if you faint not.

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Some of God's noblest sons, I think, will be selected from those that know how to take wealth, with all its temptations, and maintain godliness therewith. It is hard to be a saint standing in a golden niche.

Practicing the Presence



Many people turn to God only in their extremity. When all is well with them and life is flowing smoothly they think that their own strength is sufficient for them, but when some great misfortune overtakes them they feel the need to turn to something greater

than themselves – something stable – something powerful. They realise that of themselves they can do nothing. But because they have waited so long to turn to God they may find it difficult to have Faith in Him, for Faith is something that must be cultivated. Perhaps, too, such people feel they have no right to turn to Him when they want something, after having ignored Him when all was well. This is a needless fear. God is ready and waiting to help whenever man turn to Him. The trouble is, of course, that unless they have proved that religion is of value, they are likely, as has been stated, to be weak in Faith. And though they may pray frantically for help, they have little hope of their prayers being answered.

Some people who are healthy, happy and rich may just pay lip-service to God – if they do even that. But the sick, the miserable, the fearful, the frustrated, or the neurotic are looking for some way out of their troubles, and possibly, in desperation they turn to the higher Power. If they do not believe that God is waiting and willing to help them, however, they block up the channel through which His help flows. You

will remember that Jesus could not do many mighty works in Nazareth because of the unbelief of the people.

Those to whom God is reality are not overwhelmed by fear or misery. Sorrows come to all of us, but those with an understanding of Truth are not submerged by them. They know that within them is the Spirit of God which will strengthen and uphold them, and they are able to rise above sorrow and continue on their way. They turn to work, which is life's panacea, and God's good gift to man, and find help here.

Let us not wait to become conscious of God until some great disaster overtakes us. We should turn to Him in our joy as well as in our sorrow. Unless we make a habit of contacting Him at all times, we shall fail in Faith in our hour of need. We should desire to become consciously one with Him not merely for what we can get, but in order to put Him and His Kingdom before all else. We should want to live the life of Truth for its own sake, and not from a sense of duty, or because of what we hope to get out of it. It is more blessed to give than to receive, but when we give our reward is sure.

You may think that to love God, Who is Spirit, and cannot be seen, or heard, or touched, is something too difficult for you to achieve. But is it? Just think for a moment. Do you not love the good, the true, and the beautiful? Of course you do! And so you love God, for He is all these things. Again, do you love your fellowmen? If so, you love God, for they are His expressions. Do you love the heavens in all their glory; the

sea; the mountains and hills; the birds, beasts, and insects – all nature? Then, too, you love God for they are His creation. So it is not so difficult after all, is it?

Probably many people turn to Truth in the first place because of some material advantage they desire; but as they continue to study and put into practice the teachings, they gradually learn to want it because it IS Truth. And that is what matters; not what it does for us personally in a material way, but the manner in which it leads us to put spiritual things first and so make a worthy contribution to the betterment of the world. Unless we do this our lives are of little value.

At present the crying need is for a sense of security. We seem to be living on the edge of a volcano. We shall know peace of mind only in the Kingdom of God within us – within our hearts and our minds; and we become conscious of it only by keeping in constant touch with God and thus making a habit of including Him in all our daily undertakings. When we seek first His Kingdom and righteousness, all other things will be added unto us, for the material after all, is an expression of the Spiritual.

Seeking the Soul within

"Why are we here?" the oldest question. One answer is we are here to become more than we are – not through the circumstances that we are born into, but through an *inner search*. *To become*, this is the objective of our evolution – to express the Soul in the physical world, to exemplify, to be examples.

We are to be *active*, not merely reactive. The person who habitually *reacts* to the world is a victim of every change in their environment – sometimes happy, other times sad, sometimes positive, other times negative, always being affected, absorbed with the sense perceptions of the up and downs of the surface of life. Then one day discomfort so outweighs pleasure that it dawns on us that the outer man is an illusion, and we consider seeking spiritual awareness as the way to self-mastery. Perhaps herin lies harmony, happiness, and successful living.

It is said that the first sign of spiritual development is joyfulness. Mastery of life is not domination of material things, it is understanding their true origin and nature. Enlightened people do not try to bend the world to fit their way, to coerce events to satisfy their needs, but strive for a deeper consciousness, one which helps them to pass through difficult times because they are attuned to a Source that guides them.

In reality, the world is more mental than physical – the physical is really an extension of the mental. Things we see, hear and feel are a *revelation* to the senses of an idea already held in mind. If we would know more about what we sense we must turn to mind. Man has been to the moon but exploration of *self* for most is totally neglected.

We are born with souls but personality develops through our interaction with environment. When we encounter people that seem "difficult", it may be of value to consider that the action of the world on them has made them as they are. Perhaps they deserve sympathy more than blame. They are working out their destiny, which has little to do with us. Our task is to look through the personality to the "I", the soul within them. Then souls can meet.

But how do we perceive the Soul, what is Soul? The soul, or the "I", is the real self, that which is everlasting, that to which all things belong. I may say that my mind, my emotions, my body, belong to my real self, the Soul, or "I". When I say that I would like to exercise I mean my body would like to exercise, or when I have a pain that my body has a pain. It is important to distinguish between that which IS and that which belongs to It. So we affirm "I express God's life as perfect health" or even better "My body expresses God's life as perfect health."

Soul within people is the same, personalities are different. There can be no true inner peace and sureness of action when we are isolated from the one Source of enlightenment and power. Then we live alone in a world that appears hostile. The world is always a reflection of individual consciousness – we see things as *we* are!

Ralph Waldo Trine tells a story: There was a pool in the mountains with a waterfall fed by a mountain stream. The pool was alive, there were fish in it and a variety of birds came to visit and sing. Trees and flowers surrounded this mountain pool and the whole area was infused with fragrance and the sounds of birds and the waterfall. An early paradise – picture it in your mind's eye. Do you know such a pool? Then one day the flow was diverted upstream. The pool became stagnant and putrid, the fish died, the birds no longer came and sang, the trees wilted and the flowers around the pool died.

Just so can our lives be connected to Infinite Soul through the stream of divine Love. When we are not connected, disharmony and abuse prevails. A person in whom even *some* spiritual awareness has developed finds it disturbing to be unkind to others, because it violates good thoughts that have been laid down deeper in their mind. Being unkind produces an inner revolt.

The solution to the problems of life, whatever they may be, lies in development of *spiritual* consciousness. Human beings have mental, emotional and spiritual aspects. All are aware of their minds and their physical realms but very few are aware of their spiritual side. This lopsidedness is truly

the worst state in which to find ourselves, for as long as we respond solely to the world of our senses and intellect we are like puppets on a string.

Paul teaches us how to regain balance and control. "Whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, think these things." Love becomes the focus of our meditations, the link to Soul within us. As we turn to Light, fear and all its travelling companions – anger, envy, vengefulness – recede into the shadows behind us and we are filled with fearlessness, tolerance and trust in God in every situation. Spiritual development is very personal. We cannot buy it or sell it. It happens only through practice –thinking, feeling, acting.

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Trust in the Lord with all thine heart, lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths. – Prov. 3:5

The School of Truth has prayers at 9:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m.
