Making the effort



From my long service as a teacher a certain rapport has been built up between me and those to whom I continuously dedicate myself. I might call it a "sensitivity", something that could be compared with the physical perceptivity that is

felt when one walks past a heater and picks up a slight warmth.

The other day as I was standing at the door of the lecture hall welcoming those who were entering. I felt a certain sadness emanating from many of them and the words "Come unto Me all who are weary and heavy laden and I will give you rest" ran through my mind. There, I thought, was a promise, guaranteeing something specific to those who *did* "come unto Me".

Last month I met three children and their parents who were out of work, so that the whole family was starving. In this extremity the father was rummaging through the neighbouring dustbins trying to find some scraps of food for them. On the following Sunday morning, when speaking at a lecture, I saw that these same people had turned up and went over to ask the father how things were going, only to learn that everything was "the same." I wondered why and asked him what his occupation was. He told me, and I said, "What are you doing about it? Have you looked for a job?"

"No, of course not," he replied, "I am waiting upon God."

"What." I asked, "are you waiting for God to do?"

"To bring forth what I have been visualising," he said.

Turning to his wife I enquired, "What about you?"

"I can do such-and-such work," she answered, "and I, too, have been waiting for God. You tell us to visualise, to believe that it is done, after which our good will be poured out upon us."

"I have never said that," I corrected her. "I have said prepare your ground, fertilise it, put in your seed, cultivate that and then await results. You have taken the whole matter out of context."

It so happened that, later in the week, an acquaintance dropped in on me and told me that that same man had been to see him and that he had managed to find him a job, adding, "He's not very intelligent but I have managed to get him fixed up." This made me very happy as the thought that those children were suffering because of the indolence of their parents had greatly saddened me.

On the following night I was again lecturing and they came in just before eight o'clock. I went over to welcome them and said smiling. "Well, how are you getting on?"

"I got a job," vouchsafed the father.

"Wonderful!" I exclaimed.

"What is wonderful about that?" was the reply.

"Well," I said, "you have a job."

"Yes," he bursts out, "I have been given a car, and I am starting out at 200 rand a month, as a salesman. I am simply burning up inside!"

"Why?" I demanded in astonishment, only to hear, "Is this how God provides for me?"

I looked at him in amazement and said, "Years ago, when I had voluntarily put myself in your position of poverty, I humbled myself, bringing myself down to the level of the little man who had no background, or anything else. I sold typewriter ribbons, pencils and printing equipment, tramping from office to office until my feet were bleeding, only frequently to be very rudely received by the head typist, and you have the temerity to tell me that you 'waited for God to do something.' Do you think the School of Truth was built up upon our 'waiting for God' and ourselves doing nothing? We started with a tickey (if you can remember what that was). Out of that tickey and much spiritual agony, working and waiting for avenues to open up, digging ditches, fertilising and watering our ground, rooting out the weeds from our own consciousnesses, our present organisation was born. Yet you, having done no spadework or anything else at all, expect God to pour out His Bounty into your life. Are you not ashamed of yourself?"

"I am not ashamed," he replied. "I could very easily and happily have gone back to my own kind of work but I wanted to find out if God was concerned only with a particular stratum of society, or if the little man who had nothing would also receive, or if the teaching was, to him that hath shall be given, the rich getting richer and the poor poorer"

"Christ," I said, "taught that God is Love, that His Presence constitutes the universe, in which all are His temples and that He desires to express Himself through all of them. He went on to say, 'The Father worketh hitherto until now and I work. Come unto Me and I will give you rest! He did not say, 'Sit down and wait'. I am sorry but you deserve what you got. The anger, hatred and resentment you are harbouring are not only burning you up physically, they are ruining your life and hampering your future. You have attended lectures, read books on Truth, experimented with visualisation, but you have not understood the teaching or applied it correctly. I sat in my parent's home for two whole years asking what I ought to do and I wish there had been someone who could have told me that I had, myself, to get cracking instead of waiting for God to intervene for me."

This man reminded me of some farmers who sit on their stoeps drinking coffee, waiting for the ground to plough and cultivate itself, even to sow its own seed, then they expect God to bring the rains so that they may gather in a bounteous crop. They are very resentful when they see the Power of

Love, which they have ignored, bringing forth a golden harvest for their neighbour who has, however, not merely hoped and prayed, but has done his thinking, feeling, speaking, acting and visualising and has, in short, worked hard for his end result.

We had a student whose property is in the hail belt and every year she used to fall into an absolute panic as she asked us, "Is it possible for God to protect us as we are in the hail belt?" To which we replied, "Of course it is, since it is according to your faith that it is done unto you." Today the hail no longer falls on her farm as it still does on the neighbouring ones, bearing out that 'a thousand shall fall at thy side and ten thousand at thy right hand but it shall not come nigh thee if thou dwell in the secret place'—that is, if you live in the consciousness, or the Shadow of the Almighty, for there you will be surrounded and protected by Omnipotence, Omniscience and Omnipresence.

If you have taken every practical step, done everything that is humanly possible to bring your good to pass, remember the admonition that when you are weary and heavy laden, when your shoulders are bent (as were mine) with trying, only *then* 'Come unto me'. At that juncture, having done your part, you can sit down and demand that God produce the good which you have set in operation, for does He not say in effect "Prove Me now if I will not open the windows of heaven and pour you out a blessing that is far beyond the measure of your receptivity"?

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As now I look at my life in retrospect, I thank God for the difficulties, the problems and the unkind resistance I encountered, all of which compelled me to further strivings. I worked solely with God and today my harvest is one of heaped up good that is running over in a measure to share and to spare. Our message to you is that we have a fortune of love, health, happiness, security and protection to divide with you and if you want to participate in it, let me tell you, as I have been doing for many years, that YOU ARE IT, that it constitutes you. This Love-garden is inviting you, after all your hard work, all your straining and struggling, to enter in and rest a while. It says you have done your part so turn now your burdens and problems over to God and He will give you spiritual rest. We have to wait upon God, as we work with Him. The teaching is not just that all things are possible with Him, it is that all things are possible when we give Him our co-operation; and this I interpret as tuning in to that Spiritual Essence which none can comprehend, with a degree of feeling that none can calculate. We know that this Presence goes with us. It is like an invisible breeze that we sense but do not see, and It constitutes us, is inseparable from us, not inside, outside or through us, but is our very Selves. We have not only to acknowledge It, but to become It.

If I talk health, that is what I must radiate, if I teach happiness, I must have a smile on my face, if I claim prosperity and security, I must display these qualities. I must manifest what in consciousness I am – not just its outside forms but

also the whole composite Being of love, joy and contentment. Then, as people want they think I have, they will learn that it is within them, AS them.

I read only the headlines in the Press today, and then, if there are any comics, I turn to them. I wonder how Truth students react to what the papers print? Are they inspired with hope, upliftment, encouragement a feeling that God is in heaven, all is right with the world, or do they feel, as I sometimes do, a sense of deep depression? Let me, for a moment, look out objectively, not subjectively, and ask, "Is there a Presence that we name God?" The answer is an emphatic "Yes." Then I continue, "Is It All-power, All-knowledge, everywhere evenly present at the same time? Is It concerned with our affairs and us? Have we immediate access to It and is the Wholeness of God expressing through us; or are we but fragments of Him?" These are questions that I have to answer and there are other problems also – lies, appearances, conditions – of the present and the future.

Life is always balancing things. That is what we do continuously. We weigh up the pros and cons, the negative and positive, the good and the bad, God and the Devil, the rich and the poor, the healthy and the sick, the happy and the miserable. Unfortunately we have been so conditioned that the negative concept tilts the scales in the wrong direction. Students of Truth (who are called a peculiar people) have a great responsibility in respect of the example they are setting. They have to be what they purpose to be; they must radiate God, glorify His Presence,

show others that He is greater than conditions, personalities, groups of people, appearances and circumstances; that His nature (the only Presence in the entire universe) is inviting every single human being, white, black, brown and yellow, to "Come unto Me." God is not biased. From His point of view all who are weary and heavy laden, all who have done their part, are welcome to enter in and Omnipresence, Omniscience and Omnipotence shall give them rest, setting them forever free, free from all that is unlike the infinite LOVE that can only bless and bless, give, and give, and give.

The Image and Likeness



It is an accepted and established fact today that we all carry before us, in mind and heart, a self-image – an image of what we consciously or sub-consciously believe ourselves to be. This has been suspected by leading psychologists for

many years, but it was a renowned plastic surgeon, Dr Maxwell Maltz, who as the result of close observation brought it to light.

Some thirty years ago he had written a book, 'New Faces New Futures,' in which he tells of the amazing changes that often occur quite suddenly and dramatically in a person's personality when he or his face is altered by plastic surgery. However, as time went on, he began to ponder the many failures among his patients, for despite his skill in beautifying their features, by the removal of certain blemishes and irregularities, many of those thus treated continued to feel, behave and act just as they had before undergoing surgery.

On further investigation he found more and more phenomena which confirmed the fact that the 'self-image' or 'picture' of the individual was the real key to personality and behavior. In consequence, he published another book, 'Psycho-Cybernetics', which deals with the subject from the psychological angle.

Now, as students of Truth, we are concerned with Spirit – First Cause – from which all secondary causes stem, and the

truth concerning ourselves is that 'WE ARE MADE IN THE IMAGE AND LIKENESS OF GOD.'

God – Spirit – the Universal Creator is FIRST CAUSE. To quote St Paul: 'One God and Father of us all, Who is above all, through all and IN you all.' Whatever 'self-images' we may have had, or are still holding concerning ourselves – images of ill-health, failure, depression, lack and unhappiness – let us calmly accept the fact that these negative conditions became manifest in our life because they are what we have CONCEIVED ourselves as being. In Biblical terms we have been worshipping false gods and images. We have broken the Commandment: 'Thou shalt have no other gods but ME.'

Being made in God's Image, it follows that whatever is true of Him must be equally true of ourselves. Now one cannot imagine the Great Originating and Sustaining Life Principle of the Universe to be poor, weak, miserable, ugly, jealous, angry, uncertain or in any way limited. Then, because we are one with this Great 'I AM', companions of this same Spirit, the same must be true of ourselves. Naturally, we must learn to distinguish the True Self or Image from the little personality with which we have masked it, and then learn that this Real Self controls the outer manifestations and not vice versa.

What God is Universally, we are Individually. As we advance in knowledge and awareness, we know ourselves to be unlimited, and that in the miniature world whose centre we are, we ourselves are the very same Spirit which was known to the ancients as the ALL IN ALL, for the Great I AM is ONE.

This is the foundation – the Rock upon which we, as students of Truth, must endeavour to establish our unity with the Great Creator of All. Let us no longer be held in bondage by the seeming negative conditions with which we have surrounded ourselves, but recognise them for what they are – the effects of our own image of ourselves, the shadows cast by our own erroneous beliefs, thoughts and feelings. Accepting responsibility for them deprives them of any sinister power extraneous to ourselves and enables us to centre our minds on the Inner Spirit, implanted in us from the foundation of the world, the Christ Image of Love, Wisdom and Power.

Away then, with the old Adamic image of failure, ill health, want, inharmony and limitation. In the words of St Paul: 'Be renewed in the Spirit of your mind, and put on the New Man, that after God hath been created in righteousness', so that we may enter into 'the glorious liberty of the sons of God,' according to the Biblical promise and claim with the valiant poet, Henley:

"It matters not how strait the gate, How charged with punishment the scroll, I AM the master of my fate, I AM the captain of my soul."

The Precious Substance of Men



There are people who are content to spend their lives in pleasure seeking, and this is particularly true of some moneyed folk who have no need to earn a living. Fortunately not all the wealthy ones are content to fritter away the precious days

of life on trivialities. Many of them use their time in trying to make some contribution to the world which will be of benefit to their fellowmen, and they are ready to share what they have with those less fortunately situated.

On the other hand there are those who have had a good excuse to sit back and do nothing but who have refused to make use of it. Think how many of the great ones in history have been partial invalids, yet have overcome their ill health or affliction and by so doing have enriched the world. Milton was blind; in spite of his deafness Beethoven continued to work as long as he was able; and Robert Louis Stevenson was a sick man – to quote but a few instances. Actually, creative work such as these men did must have helped considerably to take their thoughts away from their afflictions.

In the Bible we read that the precious substance of men is to be diligent. So wrote Solomon of old; and certainly it is not in God's plan for us that we should be lazy. Those who have money and time to spare have no excuse for indolence. God's vineyard is large and the labourers few, and there is always work for those who are willing to undertake it, if they can give their service without remuneration. There are hundreds of ways in which they can occupy their time fruitfully. There are so many societies which would welcome their services, and so many millions who need their aid that no one should be able to sleep at night if he is not doing his share.

With regard to this question of work, there are people who have the will to fail, who say that they were never meant to succeed, and appear to feel almost virtuous about it. That is not the right attitude to adopt, for we are not doomed to failure except by our own wrong thinking. And it is normal to want to succeed. But as long as we believe we cannot achieve our goal we cannot expect to do so. Such folks may not be doing the work they most want to do and so find it difficult to put their best into it; but if it is necessary for them to do it they should change their attitude towards it and make up their minds to like it. This can be done by regarding it as work done for God and as service to Him; and all work can be so regarded if it is good and necessary. In the meantime they can be preparing themselves for something which will interest them more. Success in one's chosen work is important, but in order to achieve it we must get into the habit of thinking in terms of success and putting all thought of failure entirely out of our minds. It requires self-confidence and sustained effort as a rule, and the will to win. If we believe in our unity with the God within us these should not be difficult, for unity with Him means unity with all power, wisdom and strength. But if we would be successful we must do our share – our human part. We must work and persevere, for God helps those who help themselves – He helps them through their own efforts.

There are some who cannot bear any criticism of their work. If it is adverse they lose all faith in themselves; and yet everyone should learn to accept constructive criticism humbly and gratefully, and it should be a spur to further efforts. Unfortunately there are those who, even when they ask for criticism, do not really want it – all they are looking for is praise. But when it is genuine it should be helpful, and far from being discouraged they should welcome it. They may not agree with it, and then they should use their own judgment and get further opinions on it.

We should all be grateful for work and the ability to accomplish it. It is one of God's good gifts to mankind, for there can be no sense of fulfillment for anyone who wastes his life. We must work if we are to live fully and richly.

Believe ye receive

"Therefore I say unto you, what things soever ye desire when ye pray, believe ye receive them and ye shall have them." – Mark 11:24.



When Christ made this sweeping promise, He had just demonstrated the destructive power of the spoken word, by withering away a fig tree. We cannot suppose that, in destroying the tree in this way, the Master of Love could have been actuated

by any motive of pride or bad temper, and so it is obvious that He wished to show His Disciples what power there is in the word spoken with faith. To some it may seem that, by making this promise, He gave to the worthy and unworthy alike an almost frightening power. For that reason, most people have been unable to believe in this statement as a literal promise, and have "spiritualised" it away as something only for the Disciples, or the Initiates, or perhaps for some future state of being. It could not be true for us, here in this life, they think.

If Christ or the Prophets were speaking to, or writing for, only the people of their own time and world, of what value would their teaching be to us? What could the Scriptures mean to us if they were no more than an historical record of certain people? If the Bible is Scripture at all, it is so because it is for all men at all times, in any country and at any period of the world's history. It must be eternal, universal Truth, as

mathematics is eternal and true, for both come from the same eternal and true Divine Mind. Perhaps the Master had some such thought of assurance in mind when, in John 17:20, He prays to the Father, "Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on Me through their word; that they all may be one; as Thou, Father, art in Me, and I in Thee, that they also may be one in us: that the world may believe that Thou hast sent Me."

For most people, trying to make a demonstration of supply or some human harmony, the difficulty is in believing that they receive, that they actually are now receiving that for which they pray. If the body is sick, our own or that of a loved one, or if the rent has to be found today or tomorrow and there is no money in the house, or if one is hunting a job in desperation, or if there is some acute or urgent need, it is not easy to believe that demonstration is already accomplished. We try so hard to convince ourselves of this, by denial and affirmation, by concentration, will power, prayer and meditation, even by such devices as fasts and penances, and some even torture the body, but we still are unable to prove the promise.

Strangely enough we fail to make our demonstration because we are *trying* to make it, and the harder we try, the further we push it from us. It is quite simple. If we try desperately to get health, we are trying only for one reason, and that is that we are convinced that we *have not got health*. Obviously, if we believe we receive we would not have to try and *get*. So in trying to get health we are telling ourselves

that we lack health and our minds are not on having, they are on *lack*. And as long as we believe in lack, how can we demonstrate what we want? Here we are in a sort of spiritual cul-de-sac, because we can see and feel that the body is sick, or we know we have no money. What is the way out?

The Master clearly gave us the answer to this question in John's Gospel, 15:7. "If ye abide in Me and My words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you." So His words must abide in us if we are to be successful in prayer, and if they do not, then we achieve nothing, as He so clearly tells us. Why? Because He was not telling us just His own ideas but expounding for us the operation of a Divine law. And we find His words in the fifth, sixth and seventh chapters of Matthew, in what has been called "The Sermon on the Mount." Are we following these instructions? Have we forgiven those who offended against us and prayed for those who despitefully used us? Have we any resentment in our minds? Are we criticising or condemning or hating anyone? Are we working against the commandments, in thought if not in deed? Are we doing our charities in secret? Do we only desire some good for our own private benefit, so that we may indulge ourselves in some way? In modern language, are we only asking God to fix our ulcer quickly so that we can get back to the party?

The mere words we speak have no power of themselves. The power is in the feeling behind them, the ideas of which the words are only the symbols. We may affirm regularly, but perhaps we are thinking thoughts the very opposite of our affirmation. How frequently, for instance, do we find resentment and dislike to be the bars to the student's spiritual progress! How often we have to point out the impossibility of praying to a God of Love when we have a heart full of hate! How patiently we have to try and convince them that the very actions of others, which seemed so evil, are no more than steps to some good that God has provided for us? If Joseph had failed to keep his faith, in spite of what his brothers did to him, he would never have reached the eminence of Prime Minister of Egypt and then, in a position to save from starvation the very brothers who had so ill-used him, be able to say, "Ye thought evil against me, but God meant it unto good." So nothing is so "evil" but that God can turn it into good, and then we find that those who ill-used us, or the "evil" condition in which we find ourselves, is converted into an agency for good. Our enemies are but God's unconscious agents through whom He brings our good. Cannot we then forgive and even bless them?

It is as though we sat before a spiritual radio set, tuning in by the way we think. God is continually broadcasting, every moment of every day, on a wavelength of love, harmony, health, success and joy. But if our minds are on resentment, hate, failure, sickness, evil and misery, we are not receiving His broadcast. Nor can we ever receive it until we change our thought and "tune in" on the right wavelength. If we will not forgive, have we any right to expect forgiveness? If we will

not give of love, good will, tolerance, patience, friendship, service and money, have we any right to expect to receive these things? If we lived in a community where everybody was always trying to *get*, would we get anything? On the other hand, to live with those who are always *giving*, would that not result in an all-round circulation with everybody giving to everybody else, including us? So can we expect only to get, and give nothing in return?

Unless His word abides in us, unless we are prepared to follow Truth we cannot hope to "believe we receive," because we are not even praying to the One True God, but to some strange god of our own creation – a god of hate or failure or sickness. But when we have done our part we find how truly He spoke when He promised, "Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things (material blessings) will be added." Elsewhere He tells us that "the Kingdom of God is within you," and St Paul tells us, "Ye are temples of the Holy Spirit which is in you, and which ye have of God."

When we understand something of the significance of what Jesus taught us, we begin to see that demonstration does not result from going after things, from will power, or from any human activity, but in the words of the Prophet Isaiah it comes, "Not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit." When we, having done our part in abiding in Him and letting His word abide in us, we can relax in the knowledge that God is now in charge and that His perfect will of Life and Love

is now being done in us and all our affairs, we find that all things have been working together for good just as they did for Christ, for Joseph and for many other Bible characters.

Going after some blessings, desperately denying and affirming, concentrating, willing, wishing and declaring, only creates in us a state of anxious tension, which is the very antithesis of faith, and must result in non-demonstration. But giving of what we have, of love, friendship, goodwill, forgiveness, tolerance, patience, and of our money, with the feeling that we are the agents of God, that it is He giving through us from His inexhaustible resources – this is the sure way. When we understand that it is God giving through us we are no longer giving from our limited supply, but He is giving from His own limitless riches. We then become, so to say, "partners with God," and the more we dwell on this fact in our thoughts, the more we develop the ability to "believe we receive." So we acquire the consciousness of wealth, not only wealth of money, but also wealth of all those spiritual qualities mentioned above, which alone bring us blessing and happiness. There is no short cut to material good, there are no magic formulas or affirmations to give us what we think we want. Our part is to develop, by a change of our own thinking, the consciousness of the Presence of God in our minds, bodies and affairs, and that is to become channels of God's blessings.

We need have no misgivings; we can never lose by "taking a back seat" for inevitably at the most auspicious moment we shall hear the Father's word bidding us to "come up higher."
